

What happens on a typical DTS night?

Each DTS meeting has three primary components: Social - Intellectual - Spiritual

Social

The first & last 30 minutes of the evening are a time for food & fellowship. It is a time to grow together in friendship, and to eat good food!



Intellectual

The actual DTS meeting begins with a focus on a particular Saint of the Church. We look at the struggles, strengths, faith, and spirituality of that saint. We discuss the ways in which this saint is a role model for us today in our lives. We reflect upon how the saint's example provides deeper meaning for our lives - how we are challenged by the saint to be more Christ-like. All this is done in the unique DTS format (you'll have to attend DTS to know what that means).



Spiritual

The actual DTS meeting ends with prayer. We make use of traditional Catholic prayers to intercede for and lift up our community, families, and individual needs.
